

The regular meeting of the East Feliciana Parish Police Jury was called to order on September 7, 2021, at 6:00 P.M. by Police Jury President Louis Kent. President Kent offered an opening prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance was then led by Mr. Chris Hall.

The roll was called by Parish Secretary Yamesha Harris and the following jurors were present: Mr. Michael Cheatham, Mr. Kyle Fleniken, Mr. Chris Hall, Mr. Ronald Johnson, Mr. Louis Kent, Mr. Jason McCray, Mr. Richard Oliveaux, and Dr. Chrissie O'Quin. Mr. Keith Mills was absent.

A motion was made by Mr. Chris Hall, seconded by Vice President Chrissie O'Quin, to approve the agenda with 3 additions and move the visitors up. This motion passed unanimously. The additions were as follows:

1. Set Public Hearing Date for Gran Lakes Subdivision Preliminary Plat, October 4<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm
2. Representative Roy D. Adams
3. Debris Tech

A representative from Debris Tech addressed the Jury and provided information on how they would help with making debris pickup easier for the Parish. After a discussion, Mr. Fleniken stated he did not believe Debris Tech was the recommendation from the Jury for debris monitoring. Mr. Moreau informed Mr. Fleniken they would listen to the recording after the meeting and that a contract had not been signed.

State Representative Roy Adams addressed the Jury with concerns of the curfew put in place during Hurricane Ida and how it affected businesses in Jackson. He also asked the Jury why was he not notified as the state representative about the curfew. President Kent informed Representative Adams that information about the curfew appeared on the local news stations and social media. Representative Adams was informed that a Parish-Wide curfew was put in place and included Jackson because trees were down all over the Parish and in order to protect all residents of the Parish a Parish-Wide curfew was mandated. Mr. Moreau informed Representative Adams that information and updates were entered in WEB EOC as required. There was no cell service or time to contact each politician in the Parish. Mr. Moreau also stated his job is to do the greatest good for the greatest amount of people in the least amount of time. Representative Adams explained the curfew was his biggest problem. Mr. Moreau stated the curfew took the liability off the Parish. There was street broils and guns being pulled out at gas stations so a curfew was the best decision.

Mrs. Barbie Holloway and Mrs. Ashley Peoples addressed the Jury with concerns of nuisances and illegal activity on Cooper Lane. President Kent and District Attorney D'Aquilla explained the nuisance process.

A motion was made by Mr. Jason McCray, seconded by Vice President Chrissie O'Quin, to adopt the minutes from the August 16, 2021 Regular Meeting. This motion passed.

A motion was made by Mr. Kyle Fleniken, seconded by Mr. Michael Cheatham, to adopt the minutes from the September 1, 2021 Special Meeting. This motion passed.

A motion was made by Mr. Chris Hall, seconded by Vice President Chrissie O'Quin, to approve monthly invoices. This motion passed.

Mr. Chris Hall and Mr. Jason McCray will meet with the Parish Manager for important discussions. Mr. Herrod asked that he and Mrs. Julie Gardner be notified to discuss budget amendments.

Mr. Kyle Fleniken informed his committee members that he would like to work on scheduling a Buildings & Properties meeting soon.

Administrative/Homeland Security Comments were as follows:

- Informed the Jury of Hurricane Ida statistics

A motion was made by Mr. Jason McCray, seconded by Mr. Chris Hall, to accept Planning & Zoning Commission recommendation for approval of Gene Worthy and Sandra Worthy plat; Moody Professional Land Surveyors, Inc.; Lamont L. Moody III, Surveyor. This motion passed unanimously with a roll call vote.

A motion was made by Mr. Jason McCray, seconded by Vice President Chrissie O'Quin, to table and take under advisement Planning & Zoning Commission recommendation to change Planning & Zoning Ordinance to classify "Official Tow/Impound Lot"; Towing Service; and Automobile wrecking yards, junkyards and salvage yards. This motion passed.

A motion was made by Mr. Chris Hall, seconded by Mr. Kyle Fleniken, to set a public hearing for Gran Lakes Subdivision Preliminary Plat on October 4 at 5:30pm. This motion passed.

Public Comments were as follows:

Mr. David Brown addressed the Jury with McManus Road condition concerns. Mr. Brown was informed that the road in question is a private servitude.

Mr. Kyle Fleniken thanked the Jury for the purchase and use of the tractor to provide supplies for residents on the eastern side of the Parish. He also thanked volunteers, Mr. Moreau and other jurors for their help.

Mr. Terry Ross addressed the Jury with ditching concerns at 3908 Lillian Lane. After a discussion, Mr. Ross was informed by Mr. Chris Hall that the ditching was done by FEMA. Mr. Ross asked when would the ditching be done. He was informed by Mr. Moreau that it would be referred to the DPW Director and placed on a work order list. The DPW Department is responsible for scheduling.

Mr. Tyrone Johnson addressed the Jury with concerns of grading Barber Lane.

A motion was made by Mr. Jason McCray, seconded by Vice President Chrissie O'Quin, to go into executive session for no more than fifteen minutes to discuss pending litigation entitled Michael Cramer v. East Feliciana Parish Police Jury #46,153; 20<sup>th</sup> District Court. This motion passed.

A motion was made by Mr. Jason McCray, seconded by Vice President Chrissie O'Quin, to return to regular session. No action taken.

A motion was made by Mr. Chris Hall, seconded by Mr. Jason McCray, to adjourn.
